APROLMA	<p>The Asociación de Productoras Libres de Márcala (APROLMA), was created to improve institutional, organizational and commercial capabilities through the production of specialty coffees and quality products while protecting the human rights and the environment. CAFESCOR	<p>Organic high altitude specialty coffee produced in the historically rich region of Copan. The cup profile ranges from 85% to 90% (according to SCAA format).
